"Chesty's laugh is one of the best feeling sounds on Earth" Brad of GRITS Radio

- 5. Mister Bil (Email) A longtime, loyal listener from Idaho/Arizona who often flirted w/ Chesty via email.
- 6. Anyone who knew Chris knew about her complex relationship with **COFFEE!**
- 7. Shake Yourself Loose The Furors New Haven post-modern punk duo that we often caught live at a clandestine venue in Hamden, CT
- 8. Seriously, Chris would drink a pot of coffee at 11pm and fall asleep by midnight!
- 9. Rip It Up Elvis Presley Yes, she had an Elvis fetish.
- 10. Chesty was a Go-Go Dancer in The 60s on Laugh-In!
- 11. Dance Tonight Paul McCartney Chris specifically asked that this song, among others, be part of her memorial service... she played mandolin, too.

- 12. **Chesty's Bra Color Part I** Live broadcast from SWL Winterfest hotel room, Kulpsville, PA March 2007
- 13. **Too Hot To Hold Big Ella** Chesty LOVED James Brown, but who else would bring you the *female* James Brown?
- 14. Irresistible You Taj Mahal Taj Mahal's music was a big part of our lives.
- 15. Chesty's Lost Discs Radio Studio Tour! The consummate hostess.
- 16. *Once In A Lifetime* The Illusion As Chesty says on the show, our dear friends Kerri and Lee (aka, Babs and Slick) turned us on to this group. Now Chesty and Slick are in the same dimension and no doubt they're somehow dancing and digging this with us.
- 17. How Can I Be Down The Yellow Balloon

Chris had a huge crush on Don Grady – the actor who played Robbie Douglas on *My Three Sons*. In 1967 he cut an album with this group, The Yellow Balloon. We used to play *How Can I Be Down* on our anniversary and <u>laugh so hard</u> when the singer gets to the line:

Life was just a downer 'till now, Then you turned me on and oh, WOW!

- 18. *It's My Life* Crushed Butler Chesty's hometown had a vibrant punk music scene in the 1980s (cf: The Clap; The Complaints) and she carried a lifelong affection for that sound. Somewhere along the way she discovered Crushed Butler, a British punk-rock trio from the late-60s that were far ahead of the curve by pioneering that sound!
- 19. Allentown Monkey House (a short story)
- 20. *Panama Red* Old and In The Way Certain family members helped Chesty curate a sympathetic ear for The Dead et al.
- 21. Chris calls into *Radio New York International*, March 2007 (She tells of her famous encounter with Marcel Marceau)
- 22. **We Are Ships Bonnie Koloc** Another wonderful "chick pick" that Chesty brought to our attention.

- 23. *Larf and Sing* Family A fairly obscure song by a British prog group circa 1971 that otherwise speaks for itself.
- 24. **Chesty's Bra Color Part II** Live broadcast from SWL Winterfest hotel room, Kulpsville, PA March 2007
- 25. Chris Interviewed by a correspondent from Radio Slovakia
 - SWL Winterfest convention room, Kulpsville, PA March 2003 This interview originally aired twice over shortwave radio via Radio Slovakia: once in spring 2003 and again during their year-end review in December 2003
- 26. **Penetration The Pyramids** Another reveal of Chesty's naughty nature.
- 27. **The Limited-Edition Chesty Action Figure!** (promo by Cos & Jane of Lumpy Gravy Radio Show)
- 28. **98.6 Keith** Chris calls Hartford, CT radio station to request this song for her sickly husband.
- 29. *I Don't Need No Doctor* Ray Charles Chesty relates the response she got from Ray Charles that time she shouted-out in his direction!
- 30. Ain't No Sunshine Rahsaan Roland Kirk
- 31. **Chesty's Bra Color Part III** Live broadcast from SWL Winterfest hotel room, Kulpsville, PA March 2007
- 32. French Poodle Sam Butera (for Polly)
- 33. Doctor 'Doc' Brown sings and plays for Chesty's B-Day (Feb. 2006)

- 34. **Dark Horse George Harrison** Chris loved horses; loved The Kentucky Derby; rode in dressage competitions; owned a crop. George was her favorite Beatle. She identified closely with this song.
- 35. *Flip Flop and Fly* Jon Thomas This was Chesty's valiant Chick Pick following her ALS diagnosis in 2022
- 36. *I'm The Sky* Norma Tanega JimE selected this song to honor Chesty... gets chocked-up every time... btw, watch the skies for Great Blue Heron!
- 37. It Was A Very Good Year Della Reese Chesty sums it up w/ this one!
- 38. Help Me (Didn't Know What To Do) Hudson
- 39. *Cast Your Fate To The Wind* Shelby Flint We chose this as our special song when we eloped. Technically, we chose the original version by the Vince Guraldi Trio. Eventually, however, we discovered that the song has lyrics. From that point on, Chris would occasionally break into singing the first verse or two of this song while working around the house.
- 40. <u>Shake The Shit With Chesty</u> January 31, 2010 Chesty would sometimes casually rant on a political or philosophical topic that she felt passionately about. Several of our friends and associates in the radio broadcasting community encouraged her to make that a regular 5-minute segment on our radio show and call it, "Shake The Shit With Chesty". While we never followed through with that idea, this audio is a rare example of what that segment might have sounded like; food for thought.
- 41. **Passascaglia J. S. Bach** performed by Robert Fripp & The California Guitar Trio Chris loved Baroque-era music, especially Bach!
- 42. Love, Peace, and Rock-and-Roll (and Laughter)!
- 43. **Good Night, Chesty** "I'll be leaving happy; eating ice cream cakes and drinking beer!"
- 44. A moment of silence
- 45. Chris sings for us a final parting song.
